Dear Congregation members and friends,

Let me take this opportunity to thank you all for your faithfulness and support of HTLC/LCM for these past 20 months of being without a parish pastor. These have been difficult months in the life of the church after having lost a loved pastor and amidst much uncertainty in regard to the economy and its impact on our church budget. Many members have stepped up in leadership and we have been blessed by the excellent interim ministries of Pastor John Nagle and Adam Buff. We have also been blessed by the extra responsibilities that Valerie Hughes, Heidi Rueckel, Ruth Efir, Tom Alexander have shouldered during this time. It is because of this combined effort that this interim period has seen a number of positives for our ministry. The mood and climate of the congregation has remained warm and inviting as we have a number of new folks desiring to join us in membership. We will have 3 weeks of orientation and welcome folks on February 19th. Our youth and confirmation ministries have continued to run smoothly and have increased in levels of participation. Our worship ministry has been enhanced with a larger combined choir and use of rotating LCM, Youth, and Children's choirs. We acquired a Cassavant tracker organ to complete our Worship Center and enhance our worship experience. We refinanced our mortgage. We have increased adult Sunday School attendance. We now have a thriving young adult ministry. We have reorganized and revitalized our structure for ministering together as God's people.

A lot of ministry and good things have occurred in this interim period. I am glad, however, that it is coming to a close this month as the congregation voted 104 – 8 to call Pastor Will Rose to be it's Parish Pastor. He begins this month and will bring a very person-focused ministry to our setting. He is very much a

team player who understands that we can do far more together as we share our gifts and talents than we can separately. I pray that you will welcome him and his family and will then proceed to not just sit back and watch the team play here at HTLC/LCM, but will get on the court, get involved and be a part of the joy that we all can have in serving God and God's creation. All the pieces are in place for great things to happen here at HTLC/LCM.

HEALING TOWARD WHOLENESS: OUR FAITH COMMUNITIES AND MENTAL ILLNESS ALL DAY SEMINAR FRIDAY, MARCH 2, 2012 9-4:30 PM AT ST. THOMAS MORE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN CHAPEL HILL. Rev Dr. Craig Rennebohm, noted author, advocate, international lecturer, homeless mental health ministry pioneer, and founder and chaplain of Mental Health Chaplaincy in Seattle will be the keynote speaker. Dr. Michael Fuller, of U. of Texas Medical branch, will also lecture on medical issues related to mental illness disorders. After lunch there will be breakout sessions led by Rev. Dale Osborne of Binkley Baptist Church and Dr. Beth Melcher, Assistant Secretary of NC Dept of Health and Human Services. This seminar, which includes lunch, is geared to pastoral care in area congregations. Last year it was attended by over 300 area church leaders and lay people. Our church is donating \$200 to the cost of the program. Registration is open to all. Cost is \$15 by Feb 13, \$25 thereafter. Professional credits (4 CEUs) through AHEC may be obtained for an additional \$25. 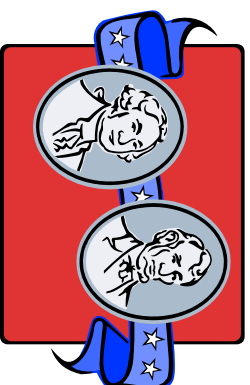

EASY:

Congregational Pastor’s office needs painted;
Door between kitchen & Augsburg Room entranceway is stuck;
Door between Fellowship Hall & Augsburg Room has trouble with handle;
Window wells need to be cleaned out at Fellowship Hall;
Several landscape lights are out;
About half of the toilet paper holders don’t work, need to be replaced (Worship Center);

Bugs in lights, need to be cleaned out;
Replace burnt out lights in Reception Hall (Former Sanctuary);
Men's toilet upstairs leaking into storage room downstairs;
Door between Reception Hall & long hallway – the rubber stopper at top of door is smashed causing door to stick. Needs to be removed or fixed. (Former Sanctuary);

2012 Offerings - Change in Giving Categories

As approved in the 2012 budget, the Building Fund income account has been integrated into the General Budget Fund. This means the Building Fund no longer exists as a separate giving category. In past years, contributions to the Building Fund went toward our mortgage, utility, insurance and other facility-related expenses. Those expense obligations still remain, but have now become part of the base operating and program expenses of the congregation. All total, our budgeted expenses come to about \$61,000 each month. Lutheran Campus Ministry Update:

Spring Semester for LCM has begun in full swing and the first 3 or 4 weeks are the weeks that seem to have the most time to devote to LCM and engage in projects and activities. After the first month, the academic rigors of the university seem to more seriously call their names and they respond. Their vocation at this point is that of student and they have hopes and dreams of where their academic pursuits will take them. LCM offers a lot of programs and activities but always recognize the unique pressures students are under here at UNC.

A lot of the focus during this period of the year is on LCM's Alternative Spring Break. This year we have three distinct trips planned. The large one is our domestic trip to South Florida where approximately 20 students and several members will have a couple of days of fun before spending 5 days in Immokalee working on home rehabilitation. A second group of 14 students and Sylvia Black are traveling to Costa Rica to work with our partner synod and learn about their ministries. 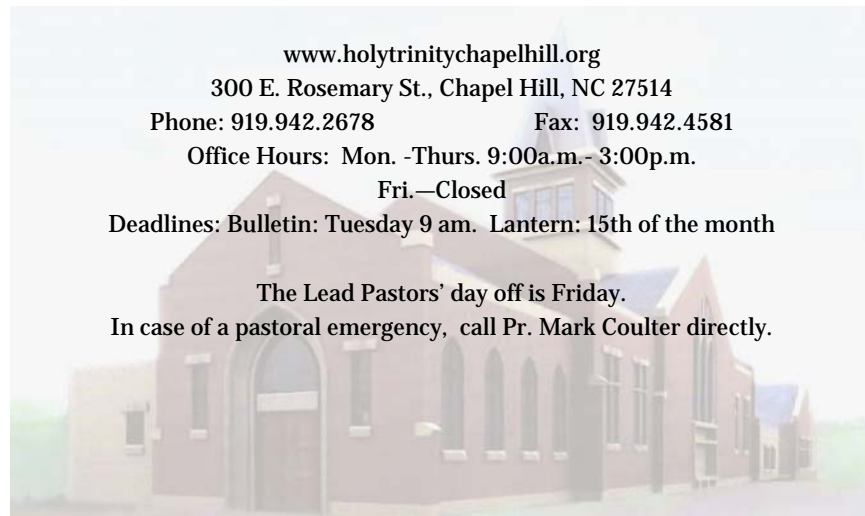
